7. Clerk's Report

- a. **Accounts Payable** – L. Yelle moved, D. Walch seconded, to approve accounts payable as presented: General Fund checks #35565 - #35639, including the electronic payroll liability payment, for \$46,229.42, Trust & Agency checks #35587 & 35588, for \$333.00 and Tax Collection checks #3478 - #3480 for \$17,166.84, for a total of \$63,729.26.
Ayes: 5 Nays: 0 Motion carried.
- b. **Budget Report** – L. Yelle report on the need for budget adjustments.
L. Yelle moved, D. Kallio seconded, to reduce Contingency by \$51 and increase the authorized Human Resources expenses by \$51, for a total of \$1701. Ayes: 5 Nays: 0 Motion carried.
L. Yelle moved, D. Walch seconded, to reduce Contingency by \$10,244 and move it temporarily to Sanitation Fund income, bringing that total to \$91,442. Once Sanitation Fund is solvent enough to cover incoming expenses the General Fund will have the \$10,244 returned. Roll call vote was unanimous. Motion carried.
- c. **2021 EAP Renewal** – D. Walch moved, L. Yelle seconded, to continue offering NorthStar EAP and to cover the extra \$27 monthly increase. Ayes: 5 Nays: 0
Motion carried.
- d. **Bittner Bill \$597** – L. Yelle moved, K. Koehn seconded, to acknowledge payment of \$597 to Bittner Engineering for work for the new Recycling & Transfer Facility. Ayes: 5
Nays: 0 Motion carried.
- e. **Election Info** – L. Yelle reported that 74% of Sands Township registered voters turn out to vote with 59% of those voters being absentee voters.

Yelle seconded, to approve the Sands Township Resolution For Acceptance of Payments by Financial Transaction Device (pending language approval by the township attorney). Roll call vote was unanimous. Motion carried.

10. New Business

- a. **6 New Tires for Ambulance** – L. Yelle moved, J. Yelle seconded, to approve the purchase of 6 new tires for the ambulance at a cost of \$1,386.80. Ayes: 5 Nays: 0
Motion carried.

- b. **Township Account for Zoom** – L. Yelle moved, D. Walch seconded, to approve setting up a Zoom account for the Township for \$149/year. Ayes: 5 Nays: 0 Motion carried.
- c. **Increased cost for delivery of roll-offs** – D. Walch moved, K. Koehn seconded, to approve the additional \$875 for delivery of the 4 roll-offs authorizing the new payment amount to Poynette Ironworks at \$27,534. Ayes: 5 Nays: 0 Motion carried.
- d. **Resignation of Ron Titter (ZBA Alternate) and Gary Aho (Garbage Truck)** – L. Yelle moved, D. Kallio seconded, to accept both resignations. Ayes: 5 Nays: 0 Motion carried.
- e. **Replacement of Fire Truck** – Informational only at this time
- f. **Purchase of Roll-Off for Glass Collection** – L. Yelle moved, D. Walch seconded, to approve the purchase of a 20-yard roll-off for glass collection. Ayes: 5 Nays: 0 Motion carried.
