Assistant Coordinator -Frank Rosado 249-3081 Sands Township kicked-off its electronics recycling program with an event for Marquette County residents on June 16 and 17, 2023, at the Sands Recycling and Transfer Station. This recycling program focuses on consumer electronics such as computers, televisions, monitors, printers, and peripherals (keyboards, cables, mice).

Going forward, Sands Township will host an electronics recycling day for **all** Marquette County residents on the third Saturday of each month from 10 a.m. to 2 p.m. (see page 4 for fees and additional information).

In November 2022, the township received a grant from the Michigan Department of Environment, Great Lakes and Energy (EGLE) that helps fund equipment, staffing, electronics recycling promotion, and allows us to participate in a transportation network to move collected electronics to other recycling centers.

#### **SUPERVISOR NOTES**

Recent accidents at the intersection of M-553 and CR480 raised questions about the four-way stop. In the past we investigated options including installing a traffic light or building a round-about. Although counter-intuitive, some experts consider a four-way stop to be safer than a standard traffic light because drivers from every direction see a stop sign. At CR480 and M-553, each driver sees a flashing red stop light in addition to the stop signs. Drivers are less likely to "run the light" at a four-way stop so accidents tend to occur less frequently and at lower speeds when they do happen. Michigan Department of Transportation (MDOT) consistently reviews accident reports and both MDOT and the County Road Commission continue to monitor the intersection.

- Former administrative assistant Pam Roberts returned to the township as the new deputy clerk.
- The Superiorland Pickleball Club donated and installed windscreens on the township sports courts.

#### TREASURER'S NEWS

Summer property tax statements were mailed on June 30, 2023, and are due to the Sands Township Treasurer on September 14, 2023. Beginning September 15, 2023, penalties will be assessed. Please allow seven days for mailed payments to arrive. If you have not received your tax statement or if your statement went to your escrow company and you would like a copy, call the office at 906-249-9169.

Two items of note regarding summer taxes:

- The Marquette-Alger Regional Educational Service Agency (MARESA) special education millage (appears as "ISD EXTRA VOTED" on your statement) that passed in the May 2, 2023, special election is reflected on summer tax bills and you will see an increase from last year as a result.
- Two other school taxes (appear as "ISD" and "SPECIAL ED" on your statement) moved from winter to summer tax statements, resulting in higher summer tax bills.

## **ELECTION NEWS FROM THE CLERK**

With the passing of Proposal 2 in 2022 there will be many changes to elections in Michigan, especially in regards to absentee ballots and early voting. At this time, we don't have answers as to how these changes will look and are waiting for guidance from the State Legislators and the Bureau of Elections. The winter edition of our newsletter will have more information regarding these changes and how absentee voting and early voting will look as we head into 2024 and a busy election year. The Presidential Primary is the first election where you will see several of these changes in effect.

We are always looking for more people interested in working as election inspectors for early voting and on election day. If you would like to get involved, you can get an application from the Township office. Training for election inspectors will be done in late 2023 to prepare for the upcoming election year.

#### FIRE DEPARTMENT UPDATE

#### Smoke Alarm and CO Detector Program:

The Sands Township Volunteer Fire Department (STFD) has smoke alarms and carbon monoxide detectors that are available to township residents free of charge. To receive alarms, they must be installed by a member of STFD and documented with the Michigan Prevention database.

**Did you know?** Smoke alarms are recommended inside each bedroom, outside each sleeping area, and on every level of the home, including the basement - at a minimum.

#### **Cadet Program Update:**

At the beginning of the year, STFD was able to send our two cadet firefighters to Firefighter 1 & 2 school. The cadets completed classroom work two nights a week and hands on training on Saturdays from January to the end of May. On May 27, both cadets successfully passed their final practical evaluation. When these cadets turn 18 years old they will be eligible to become certified firefighters in the State of Michigan.

In June 2023, the department received a grant from the KBIC's 2% fund that will go towards the purchase of critical life saving equipment needed by the department. ### **Sanitation News and Reminders**

- Have your garbage out by 4 a.m. we start early!
- Wash or rinse your trash can as needed, and replace cans that are cracked or broken.
- If animals get into your garbage, it is your responsibility to clean it up.
- Large items and bags weighing more than 30 pounds cannot be taken.
- Our garbage crew will not pick up building materials, appliances, furniture, carpet, or metal. Please call our office to find out how to dispose of these items at the:
  - Sands Recycling and Transfer Station for a fee (cash or check only - see below), or
  - Marquette County landfill using a permit purchased at the township office.
- Items containing freon must be taken to the County landfill for disposal after obtaining a \$40 per item permit from the Sands Township office.
- Sands Township does not offer curbside recycling. Your recycling can be brought to the Transfer Station free of charge.
- Do not throw used batteries in the trash! You can bring them by the Township Office or the Sands Recycling and Transfer Station for recycling.

Beginning December 1, 2023, the Marquette County Solid Waste Management Authority (MCSWMA) (landfill) will begin observing new seasonal hours as follows:

- From December 1 through March 31, hours will be 7 a.m. to 3 p.m.
- From April 1 through November 30, hours will be 6:30 a.m. to 4 p.m.



#### **Electronics Recycling Hours and Fees:**

3rd Saturday of each month 10 a.m. - 2 p.m.

- Computers (desktop, laptop, tablets) no charge
- Printers no charge
- Cables, cords, wires, keyboards, mice, stereo equipment, DVD/CD players, satellite tuner boxes, routers, other miscellaneous items
   no charge
- LCD small computer monitors no charge
- CRT computer monitors \$5 each
- Flat Screen TVs and box TVs \$5

In the first half of 2023, Sands Township had 2,089 unique visits by residents to the Recycling and Transfer Station to drop off plastic, paper, metal and glass recycling, with most recycling activity occurring on Wednesdays.
